

Dale Reed enters his 19th season as the Head Boys Basketball Coach at The Woodlands High School having compiled a 406-196 (165-61 District) record over his first 18 seasons. Reed has guided his squad to thirteen 20+ win seasons during that time and his teams have reached the Texas 5A/6A State-Playoffs in each of his 18 years at the helm. Reed has been named District Coach of the Year 6 times (2006-07, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2016-17 & 2017-18). After the 2014-15 season Coach Reed was selected as All Montgomery County Coach of the Year. This past season (2022-23) Coach Reed guided the team to a 23-9 (13-3) record while finishing tied for 2nd in the very competitive District 13-6A. Reed also reached the 400-win level as a Head Coach at The Woodlands by beating Conroe 60-55 on January 21, 2022. This same season Coach Reed became The Woodlands HS all-time leader in wins by winning his 380th game vs. Willis 53-27 on January 29th, 2022. In May, 2023 Coach Reed and his staff were selected by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC) to coach in the TABC All Star game. Coach Reed was also selected as the North Coach for the Houston Area Basketball Coaches Association (HABCA) All Star game in May of 2011. Reed was the President of HABCA during the 2016-17 year. In addition to their on-the-court success, Reed's teams have done their part as well as The Woodlands High School has won the Lone Star Cup 9 times including this past season 2022-23 during Reed's tenure. The honor is given by the University Interscholastic League (UIL) and is based on academic and athletic extracurricular achievements. The Woodlands High School has also been highly ranked by ESPN RISE FAB 50 the past few years including the #1 ranking for all sports for the year of 2009.

Reed's pedigree in basketball is rich in tradition, as his career has granted him the opportunity to play for and work with some of the great basketball minds in recent history, including three coaches who have all won collegiate National Coach of the Year honors.

As a highly touted guard at Little Snake River Valley High School in his hometown of Baggs, Wyoming, Reed shattered numerous school records en route to leading his team to two state championships while playing for his now deceased father, Ed Reed, a member of the High School Coaches Hall of Fame. A prolific scorer and consummate team player, Reed was recruited by many of the top collegiate programs of that time, and agreed to attend the University of Iowa to play for Dr. Tom Davis.

After a successful stint at Iowa, Reed transferred to Washington State University for the opportunity to play for then head coach, and current University of Houston Head Coach Kelvin Sampson. A team captain his last two seasons at WSU, Reed's leadership and floor presence was instrumental in leading the Cougars to a 20-win season and a berth to its first NCAA Tournament in 11 years during his senior year.

Reed's first coaching stop took him to Blinn College in Brenham, Texas, where he served as an assistant coach for three seasons. Working under the helm of now deceased Joe Curl, Reed accompanied Curl to the University of Houston to help resurrect a dormant women's basketball program. Reed assisted in all areas of the basketball program while at Houston, and was integral in laying the foundation for a program that has made its mark on the national landscape of Division I women's basketball over the last several years.

After making a brief career change that took him out of coaching, Reed's passion and love for basketball drove him back into the coaching ranks. As an assistant coach for the varsity boys'

basketball team at Westfield High School (Houston, Texas), Reed's basketball knowledge and experience helped guide his squad to the playoffs each of his two seasons there.

Reed's success at Westfield led him to take over the helm at New Caney High School (New Caney, Texas). While at New Caney, Reed took a struggling program that had tallied only five wins the season prior to his arrival, and led them to double-figure wins.

Reed received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Management and a Master's of Education (Athletic Administration) Degree at Washington State University.

Reed is married to Stephenie Reed and has eight children, Rachel (26) and Bruce (18), Taneal (23), Camie (22), Danielle (19), Spencer (17), Nathan (15) and Gavin (13). During his free time, Reed enjoys travelling and spending time with his family & friends. He is an avid sports fan, as he enjoys attending Highlander football games and cheering on the Houston Astros, Rockets and Texans. Coach Reed resides in Spring, TX.
